## Funding Information

### Planning for Grants

Prior to submitting a proposal consider drafting a concept paper or using a logic model to clarify:

- what you want to accomplish (short-term and long-term) in terms of outputs, outcomes, and impact;
- the consumers or customers, their characteristics, and unmet need;
- activities necessary to achieve the outcomes;
- your organization's investment and that of others;
- internal and external influences;
- assumptions; and
- challenges and resolutions.
