Grant Notice

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- Grants are relevant to national welfare reform, workforce development, faith and community-based initiatives, adult education, and more.
- Grants are from agencies and organizations within various states, federal agencies, and national foundations. The Federal Register is reviewed daily.
- Grants are listed in alphabetical order.
- Eligible entities are identified. Faith-based organizations may be eligible to apply for funding as nonprofits.
- By using “control f” in a Word document or the “Search”  feature in a pdf file, you can search this grant notice using key words such as nonprofit, national, the abbreviation for your state, etc.

Assets for Independence Demonstration Program

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: State, County, City/Township, Special District, or Tribal Governments, Independent School Districts, Institutions of Higher Education, Public Housing Authorities, Indian Housing Authorities, Faith and Community-based Organizations

Funder: U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families

Amount: Award Amount per project period: \$327,273

Description: The Administration for Children and Families, Office of Community Services will accept applications for financial assistance to establish and administer Assets for Independence (AFI) Projects. These projects assist low-income people in becoming economically self-sufficient. They do so by teaching project participants about economic and consumer issues and enabling them to establish matched savings accounts called Individual Development Accounts (IDA) in order to save for a first home, a business or higher education. Grantees must participate in an on-going national evaluation of the impact of AFI Projects and IDAs.

Casey Family Scholarships

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: Applicants must:

- Have been in foster care for one consecutive year at the time of their 18th birthday OR have been adopted or taken into legal guardianship out of foster care or upon the death of their parents after their 16th birthday OR have lost both parents to death before the age of 18 and not been subsequently adopted or taken into legal guardianship.
- Be enrolled in or accepted into an accredited post-secondary program at the undergraduate level (university, college, community college or vocational/technical institute.)
- Be under the age of 25 on March 31, 2010.
- Have been in foster care or orphaned while living in the United States. U.S. citizenship is not required.

Funder: Orphan Foundation of America

Amount: Between \$1,500 and \$10,000 a year.
