- Grants are relevant to national welfare reform, workforce development, faith and community-based initiatives, adult education, and more.
- Grants are from agencies and organizations within various states, federal agencies, and national foundations. The Federal Register is reviewed daily.
- Grants are listed in alphabetical order.
- Eligible entities are identified. Faith-based organizations may be eligible to apply for funding as nonprofits.
- By using “control f” in a Word document or the “Search”  feature in a pdf file, you can search this grant notice using key words such as nonprofit, national, the abbreviation for your state, etc.

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: Children Ages 6-12, Teens Ages 13-17

Description: The purpose of the Improving Literacy through School Libraries program is to improve student reading skills and academic achievement by providing students with increased access to up-to-date school library materials; well-equipped, technologically advanced school library media centers; and well-trained, professionally certified school library media specialists.

Social Innovation Fund (SIF)

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: SIF awards will be made to approximately seven to 10 intermediaries (existing grantmaking institutions or eligible partnerships) who currently make strategic investments in nonprofit community organizations.

Funder: Corporation for National and Community Service

Amount: \$50 Million

Description: A new public-private investment opportunity established by the 2009 Edward M. Kennedy Serve America Act, the Social Innovation Fund is designed to:

- Fund effective and potentially transformative portfolios of nonprofit community organizations to help them strengthen their evidence base, and replicate and expand to serve more low-income communities;
- Identify more effective approaches to addressing critical social challenges and broadly share this knowledge; and
- Develop the grantmaking infrastructure necessary to support the work of social innovation in communities across the country.

The Corporation will award up to \$50 million in Federal funding to an estimated seven to 10 intermediary organizations.
