- Grants are relevant to national welfare reform, workforce development, faith and community-based initiatives, adult education, and more.
- Grants are from agencies and organizations within various states, federal agencies, and national foundations. The Federal Register is reviewed daily.
- Grants are listed in alphabetical order.
- Eligible entities are identified. Faith-based organizations may be eligible to apply for funding as nonprofits.
- By using “control f” in a Word document or the “Search”  feature in a pdf file, you can search this grant notice using key words such as nonprofit, national, the abbreviation for your state, etc.

### Active Living Research and New Connections Grant Opportunities

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** Preference will be given to applicants that are either public entities or nonprofit organizations.

**Funder:** Robert Wood Johnson Foundation

**Amount:** \$2.6 Million

**Deadline:** April 14, 2010

**Description:** This program supports research to inform policy and environmental strategies for increasing physical activity among children and adolescents, decreasing their sedentary behaviors and preventing obesity.

### Amy’s Courage Fund

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** Nonprofit Organizations (usually a local domestic violence or advocacy program) must apply on behalf of the victim.

**Funder:** National Network to End Domestic Violence

**Amount:** Up to \$2,000

**Deadline:** Ongoing

**Description:** The Amy's Courage Fund was established to help ease the financial restrictions that often prevent a victim from escaping abuse. This fund provides emergency financial assistance of up to \$2,000 to victims of domestic violence and their children to meet their immediate needs after escaping an abusive home.

## **HOPE III-OVC FY10 Helping Organizations and Programs Expand**

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** State Governments, County Governments, City or Township Governments, Institutions of Higher Education, Native American Tribal Governments, Nonprofits

**Funder:** U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Office for Victims of Crime

**Amount:** \$250,000

**Deadline:** April 20, 2010

**Description:** The overarching goal for this project is to expand the vision and impact of the crime victim services field. Five grantees will be selected to: collectively undertake a comprehensive analysis of the current state of the crime victims' field in the U.S., with each grantee conducting a critical portion of the analysis; and develop a consensus document that provides a philosophical and strategic framework for defining the role of the field in the country's response to crime and moving the field forward in the future.
