- Grants are relevant to national welfare reform, workforce development, faith and community-based initiatives, adult education, and more.
- Grants are from agencies and organizations within various states, federal agencies, and national foundations. The Federal Register is reviewed daily.
- Grants are listed in alphabetical order.
- Eligible entities are identified. Faith-based organizations may be eligible to apply for funding as nonprofits.
- By using “control f” in a Word document or the “Search”  feature in a pdf file, you can search this grant notice using key words such as nonprofit, national, the abbreviation for your state, etc.

### Drug Free Communities Support Program

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** Community-based coalitions focused on addressing youth substance use.

**Funder:** U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Substance and Mental Health Administration

**Amount:** \$18.75 Million

**Deadline:** March 19, 2010

**Description:** This initiative was established to achieve two major goals:

- Establish and strengthen collaboration among communities, public and private nonprofit agencies, and Federal, State, local, and tribal governments to support the efforts of community coalitions to prevent and reduce substance use among youth. For the purposes of this RFA, “youth” is defined as individuals 18 years of age and younger.
- Reduce substance use among youth and, over time, reduce substance abuse among adults by addressing the factors in a community that increase the risk of substance abuse and promoting the factors that minimize the risk of substance abuse. (Substances include, but are not limited to, narcotics, depressants, stimulants, hallucinogens, inhalants, marijuana, alcohol, and tobacco, where their use is prohibited by Federal, State, or local law. Substances may also include the non-medical use of prescription drugs or over-the-counter medicines.) Note: DFC efforts must focus on multiple drugs of abuse. When the term “drug” or “substance” is used in this funding announcement, it is intended to include all of the above drugs.

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** Individuals

**Funder:** National Endowment for the Humanities

**Amount:** \$50,400

**Deadline:** May 4, 2010

**Description:** Fellowships support individuals pursuing advanced research that is of value to humanities scholars, general audiences, or both. Recipients usually produce articles, monographs, books, digital materials, archaeological site reports, translations, editions, or other scholarly resources.

## **FY 2010 Second Chance Act Mentoring Grants to Nonprofit Organizations**

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** Native American Tribal Governments, Nonprofits

**Funder:** U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance

**Amount:** \$300,000

**Deadline:** March 19, 2010

**Description:** There are currently over 2.3 million individuals serving time in our federal and state prisons, and millions of people cycling through local jails every year. Ninety-five percent of all prisoners incarcerated today will eventually be released and will return to communities. The Second Chance Act will help ensure the transition individuals make from prison or jail to the community is safe and successful.

## **OVW FY 2010 Education, Training, and Enhanced Services to End Violence Against and Abuse of Women With Disabilities Grant Program**

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** States, Units of Local Governments, Indian Tribal Governments or Tribal Organizations, Nonprofit and Nongovernmental Victim Services Organizations, such as a State domestic violence or sexual assault coalition or nonprofit, nongovernmental organizations serving disabled individuals.

**Funder:** U.S. Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women

**Amount:** \$400,000-\$600,000

**Deadline:** March 9, 2010

**Description:** The goal of the Disability Grant Program is to create sustainable, systemic change that will result in effective services for individuals with disabilities who are victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking and hold perpetrators of such crimes accountable.
