- Grants are relevant to national welfare reform, workforce development, faith and community-based initiatives, adult education, and more.
- Grants are from agencies and organizations within various states, federal agencies, and national foundations. The Federal Register is reviewed daily.
- Grants are listed in alphabetical order.
- Eligible entities are identified. Faith-based organizations may be eligible to apply for funding as nonprofits.
- By using “control f” in a Word document or the “Search”  feature in a pdf file, you can search this grant notice using key words such as nonprofit, national, the abbreviation for your state, etc.

### Enhanced Training and Services to End Violence Against and Abuse of Women Later in Life Program

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** Applicants are limited to States, units of local government, Indian Tribal governments or Tribal organizations, and nonprofit, nongovernmental victim services organizations with demonstrated experience in assisting elderly women or demonstrated experience in addressing sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking, including faith- and community-based organizations.

**Funder:** U.S. Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women (OVW)

**Amount:** \$400,000

**Deadline:** Letter of Intent: February 24, 2010

Application: March 10, 2010

**Description:** Recognizing that individuals who are 50 years of age or older who are victims of elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation, including sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking, face unique barriers to receiving assistance, Congress created the Enhanced Training and Services to End Violence Against and Abuse of Women Later in Life Program. In Federal Fiscal Year 2010, OVW plans to fund projects that will support a comprehensive approach to addressing elder abuse in their communities.

### **Transitional Housing Assistance Grants for Victims of Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking Program**

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** Applicants are limited to States, units of local government, Indian tribes, and other organizations, including faith-based and other community organizations, that have a documented history of effective work concerning sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.

**Funder:** U.S. Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women (OVW)

**Amount:** \$250,000

**Deadline:** Letter of Intent: February 17, 2010

Application: March 9, 2010

**Description:** This funding program focuses on a holistic, victim-centered approach to providing transitional housing services that move individuals into permanent housing. Grants made under this

grant program support programs that provide assistance to victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and/or stalking who are in need of transitional housing, short-term housing assistance, and related support services.
