~ June Grant Notice 10 ~

- Grants are relevant to national welfare reform, workforce development, faith and community-based initiatives, adult education, and more.
- Grants are from agencies and organizations within various states, federal agencies, and national foundations. The Federal Register is reviewed daily.
- Grants are listed in alphabetical order.
- Eligible entities are identified. Faith-based organizations may be eligible to apply for funding as nonprofits.
- By using “control f” in a Word document or the “Search”  feature in a pdf file, you can search this grant notice using key words such as nonprofit, national, the abbreviation for your state, etc.

### Books for Children Program

**Availability:** Nationally (Minnesota libraries need to contact the foundation before applying.)

**Eligible Entities:** Independent libraries including libraries part of a county, regional, or cooperative library system. Applications are accepted from school libraries only if they also serve as the public library.

**Funder:** Libri Foundation

**Amount:** (Books are provided. No funding.)

**Deadline:** August 15, 2010

**Description:** The foundation donates new, quality hardcover children's books to small, rural public libraries.

### Service Learning Workshop Mini-Grants

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** Community Colleges

**Funder:** American Association of Community Colleges

**Amount:** \$2,000 (A \$2,000 cash or in-kind match is required.)

**Deadline:** August 6, 2010

**Description:** Funds are available to host a workshop for the recipient college and at least four other community colleges between October 1, 2010 and May 31, 2011. The workshops are to focus on aspects of service learning specific to the community college experience and feature plans or activities related to the Martin Luther King, Jr., Day of Service.

## Smaller Learning Communities Program

*(Note: This is from Fiscal Year 2009 Funds.)*

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** Lead Education Agencies including schools funded by the Bureau of Indian Education and education service agencies, applying on behalf of large public high schools; consortium applications and educational service agencies; and previous grantees

**Funder:** U.S. Department of Education

**Amount:** \$32,674,540

**Estimated Range of Awards:** \$800,000-\$5,000,000

**Maximum Award Amount:** \$2,500,000 (see the announcement for more details)

**Deadline:** Notice of Intent to Apply is due July 13, 2010. Applications are due August 6, 2010.

**Description:** Purpose is to restructure large public schools into smaller units for the purpose of improving academic achievement (e.g., freshman academies, multi-grade academies organized around career interests or other themes, "houses" in which small groups of students remain together throughout high school, and autonomous schools-within-a-school. Restructuring is typically complemented by other personalized strategies such as student advisories, family advocate systems, and mentoring programs. There are four priorities: (1) Preparing all students to succeed in postsecondary education and careers; (2) Common planning time for teachers; (3) Projects in which fifty percent or more of the included schools are low-achieving; and (4) Projects in which at least one but less than fifty percent of the included schools are low-achieving.

## Women Helping Others

**Availability:** United States and Puerto Rico

**Eligible Entities:** Organizations must have been incorporated for a minimum of three years prior to application. Preference will be given to organizations with an operating budget of \$3 million or less, those not dependent upon government grants (government funding less than thirty percent of income), and those with greater organizational program costs than personnel costs (salaries and wages and benefits not more than fifty percent of budget). Organizations must have 501(c) (3) classification can apply. (Religious organizations are ineligible.) **Funder:** Women Helping Others Foundation

**Amount:** Unknown.

**Deadline:** September 14, 2010 by 5:00 p.m.
