- Grants are relevant to national welfare reform, workforce development, faith and community-based initiatives, adult education, and more.
- Grants are from agencies and organizations within various states, federal agencies, and national foundations. The Federal Register is reviewed daily.
- Grants are listed in alphabetical order.
- Eligible entities are identified. Faith-based organizations may be eligible to apply for funding as nonprofits.
- By using “control f” in a Word document or the “Search”  feature in a pdf file, you can search this grant notice using key words such as nonprofit, national, the abbreviation for your state, etc.

America's Historical and Cultural Organizations: Implementation Grants

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: Any U.S. nonprofit organization with IRS (501(c)(3) tax-exempt status is eligible, as are state and local governmental agencies not limited to public, school, academic, and research libraries, museums, disciplinary and professional associations, cultural institutions, state humanities councils, and institutions of higher learning.

Funder: National Endowment for the Humanities

Amount: \$400,000 up to \$1,000,000

Deadline: August 18, 2010

Description: Grants support projects in the humanities that explore stories, ideas, and beliefs in order to deepen our understanding of our lives and world including content and interactivity that excite, inform, and stir thoughtful reflection upon culture, identity, and history in creative and new ways. Applicants must submit a full walkthrough for an exhibition, or a prototype or storyboard for a digital project, which demonstrates a solid command of the humanities ideas and scholarship that relate to the subject. Applicants should have already finished most of the planning for their projects, including the identification of key humanities themes, relevant scholarship, and program formats.

America's Historical and Cultural Organizations: Planning Grants

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: Any U.S. nonprofit organization with IRS (501(c)(3) tax-exempt status is eligible, as are state and local governmental agencies not limited to public, school, academic, and research libraries, museums, disciplinary and professional associations, cultural institutions, state humanities councils, and institutions of higher learning.

Funder: National Endowment for the Humanities

Amount: \$40,000 to \$75,000

Deadline: August 18, 2010

Description: Grants support projects in the humanities that explore stories, ideas, and beliefs in order to deepen our understanding of our lives and world including content and interactivity that excite, inform, and stir thoughtful reflection upon culture, identity, and history in creative and new ways. These grants should encourage dialogue, discussion, and civic engagement, and learning among people of all ages. Planning grants are available for projects that may need further development before applying for implementation and may include the identification and refinement of the project's main humanities ideas and questions, consultation with scholars, preliminary audience evaluation, preliminary design of the proposed interpretive formats, beta testing of digital formats, development of complementary programming, research, or the drafting of interpretive materials.

Help America Vote Act (Modification)

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: Nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education, nonprofits that do not have a 401(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education, private institutions of higher education, and faith-based and community organization that meet eligibility requirements.

Funder: U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families

Amount: \$367,920

Award Ceiling: \$183,960

Award Floor: \$91,980

Expected Number of Awards: 4

Description: The purpose is to promote full participation in the electoral process for individuals with disabilities, including registering to vote, casting a vote, and accessing polling places; developing proficiency in the use of voting systems and technologies as they affect individuals with disabilities, demonstrating and evaluating the use of such systems and technologies by individuals with disabilities (including blindness) in order to assess the availability and use of such systems and technologies for such individuals, and providing T/TA for non-visual access.

USDA-Food and Nutrition Service-Hunger Free (Modification)

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: Public or private non-profit organization including, but not limited to state or local government, agencies providing social services, public health organizations, educational entities, and other private non-profit entities such as community-based or faith-based organizations, food banks, or other emergency feeding organizations.

Funder: U.S. Department of Agriculture

Amount: \$5,000,000 (Federal share is 80 percent.)

Award Ceiling: \$100,000
