- Grants are relevant to national welfare reform, workforce development, faith and community-based initiatives, adult education, and more.
- Grants are from agencies and organizations within various states, federal agencies, and national foundations. The Federal Register is reviewed daily.
- Grants are listed in alphabetical order.
- Eligible entities are identified. Faith-based organizations may be eligible to apply for funding as nonprofits.
- By using “control f” in a Word document or the “Search”  feature in a pdf file, you can search this grant notice using key words such as nonprofit, national, the abbreviation for your state, etc.

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: Non-profit status, including a tax-exempt determination letter from the IRS or proof of the organization's charitable purpose. 501(c)(3) organizations, schools, or libraries may be eligible for a cash donation (See <http://www.officedepotfoundation.org/eligibility.asp>).

Funder: Office Depot Foundation

Amount: \$50 to maximum of \$3,000

Deadline: Applications are retrieved monthly.

Description: Three funding focuses include:

1. Making a Difference in Children's Lives - to support activities that serve, teach and inspire children, youth and families;
2. Building Communities - to support civic organizations and activities that serve the needs of our community; and D
3. isaster Relief - to support disaster relief efforts of recognized national, regional and local agencies, and to provide disaster relief to Office Depot associates who have experienced catastrophic loss.

Eligible Entities: State governments, county governments, city or township governments, special district governments, independent school districts, public and state controlled institutions of higher education, Native American tribal governments (Federally recognized), public housing

authorities/Indian housing authorities, Native American tribal organizations (other than Federally recognized tribal governments), nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education, nonprofits that do not have a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education, private institutions of higher education, for profit organizations other than small businesses, small businesses, and faith-based and community organizations that meet eligibility requirements.

Amount: \$1,750,000

Description: Applications will be accepted to fund up to five one-year grants for social services and income maintenance benefits enrollment coordination. These grants will carry out three core functions:

1. utilizing existing community access points for the benefits enrollment coordination process for under served residents;
2. combining technology and expert analysis to accurately assess individual and family eligibility for multiple benefits and services of government entities; and,
3. providing mechanisms for sustaining collaboration between community nonprofit organizations and government agencies for benefits determination and eligibility.
