- Grants are from agencies and organizations within various states, federal agencies, and national foundations. The Federal Register is reviewed daily.
- Grants are listed in alphabetical order.
- Eligible entities are identified. Faith-based organizations may be eligible to apply for funding as nonprofits.

### Mentoring Children of Prisoners

**Availability:** Nationally

**Eligible Entities:** State, county, and city or township governments, independent school districts, public and state controlled institutions of higher education, Native American tribal governments and organizations, and nonprofits: Faith-based and community organizations that meet eligibility requirements are eligible to receive awards under this funding opportunity announcement

**Funder:** US Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families

**Amount:** \$21,500,000

**Award Ceiling:** \$1,000,000

**Award Floor:** \$200,000

**Expected Number of Awards:** 80

**Deadline:** July 30, 2010

**Description:** This program supports the creation and maintenance of one-on-one mentoring relationships between children of incarcerated parents and caring, supportive adult volunteer mentors. The intent of this program is to support the establishment or expansion and operation of mentoring programs, using a network of public and private community entities, in areas with substantial numbers of children of incarcerated parents. The program is designed to be a community-based mentoring program in which children and youth ages four up to age 18 are appropriately matched with an adult mentor, who has been screened and trained, for a one-on-one, friendship-oriented (non curriculum-based) mentoring relationship.
