- Grants are relevant to national welfare reform, workforce development, faith and community-based initiatives, adult education, and more.
- Grants are from agencies and organizations within various states, federal agencies, and national foundations. The Federal Register is reviewed daily.
- Grants are listed in alphabetical order.
- Eligible entities are identified. Faith-based organizations may be eligible to apply for funding as nonprofits.
- By using “control f” in a Word document or the “Search”  feature in a pdf file, you can search this grant notice using key words such as nonprofit, national, the abbreviation for your state, etc.

Amy’s Courage Fund

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: In order to receive aid from the Amy’s Courage Fund, a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization (usually a local domestic violence or advocacy program) must apply on behalf of the victim.

Funder: National Network to End Domestic Violence

Amount: \$2,000

Deadline: Open

Description: Any adult survivor of domestic violence is eligible to receive funds. However, a domestic violence survivor must work with a domestic violence shelter/program or domestic violence coalition to submit an application for this fund.

The following is a list of fundable expenses

- moving and transportation costs associated with escaping abuse, such as plane, train or bus tickets, U-Haul rentals, hotels and other travel expenses;
- rent and security deposits for new, safe homes;
- utilities, utility deposits, phone hookups for new, safe homes;
- medical expenses;
- legal fees and expenses for filing for protective orders, custody agreements and divorces;
- car repairs and transportation needs; and
- furniture, appliances, clothing and other household goods.

Do Something

Availability: Nationally

Eligible Entities: To be eligible, applicants must be no older than 25 and a U.S. or Canadian citizen.
